Veterinarian determined cause of death as severe gastric and SI loop distension from air. Suspected animal was anxious during flight which lead to panting and air distension of stomach resulting in increased abdominal pressure on major abdominal vessels with subsequent hypotension and shock.

# **Description of the Cause of the Incident:**

Evidence of multifocal scarring along the subendocardial lining of the ventricles –likely an indication of hypertrophic or dilated cardiomyopathy- finds often associated with chronic cardiomyopathy found in brachycephalic breed with congenital anatomical uppoer respiratory challenges –result was acuto cardio pulmonary arrest.
