Financial Assistance

Flexible, low-cost, long-term credit assistance (loans, loan guarantees, and lines of credit) – \$100 B available – for a wide range of eligible projects; and taxexempt bonds – \$15 B available – for public-private partnerships.

Technical Assistance

Grants for project planning and development, community solutions, and advisory services; and opportunities for training and education on the use of innovative project planning, financing, and delivery techniques


What is a Regional Infrastructure Accelerator (RIA)?

- Established under the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act
 - Part of the Transportation Infrastructure
 Finance and Innovation (TIFIA) Program
- Regional Infrastructure Accelerators (RIAs):
 - Serve a defined geographic region
 - Act as a resource to the region





10 Regional Infrastructure Accelerators




- \$10M awarded to 10 accelerators in 2 rounds
- 2nd round included a Transit Oriented Development project and regional transit planning
- Additional \$24 M for 3rd

Application ratings:

"High" receives a strong rating in at least 6 criteria

"Medium"

receives a rating of moderate or a combination of strong and moderate in at least 6 criteria "Low"

receives 5 or more marginal ratings




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Section V - Selection Criteria
