



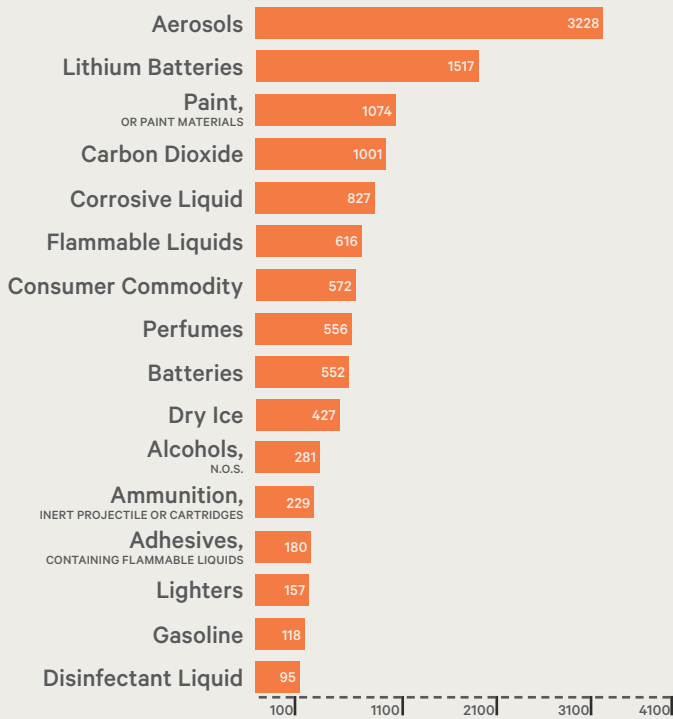
IS HAZARDOUS MATT HIDING IN YOUR PACKAGE?



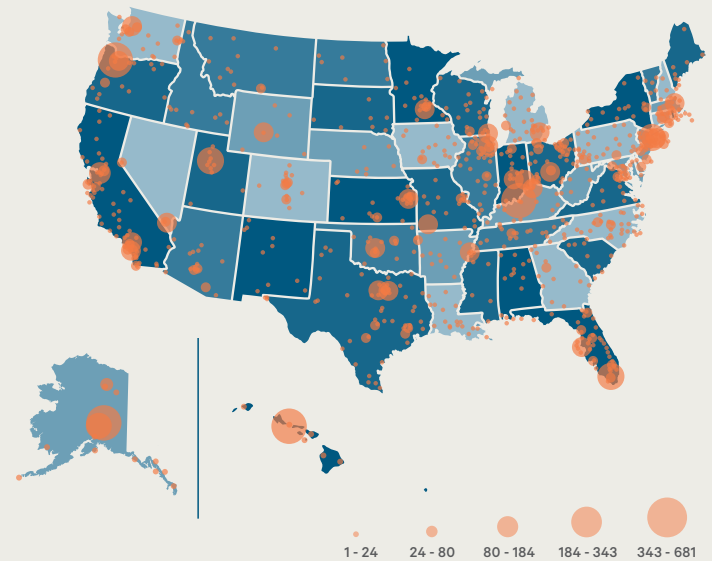
EACH YEAR, APPROXIMATELY 1,500 TRANSPORTATION INCIDENTS OCCUR WHEN **UNDECLARED HAZARDOUS MATERIALS** ARE SHIPPED.

THESE INCIDENTS INVOLVE DIVERSE TYPES OF HAZARDOUS MATERIALS AND CAUSE SERIOUS SAFETY CONSEQUENCES FOR TRANSPORTATION WORKERS, EMERGENCY RESPONDERS, AND THE GENERAL PUBLIC.

NOTABLE INCIDENTS



LYNBROOK, NY: 2019 - An undeclared shipment containing drain cleaner classified as a corrosive liquid leaked in the package during transportation via UPS. Upon arriving to the destination an employee unloading the material was exposed to the material and hospitalized as a result.



DETROIT, MI: 2020 - An undeclared package containing hydrogen peroxide was discovered leaking at a FedEx facility. Employees contained the leak and secured the package, but five employees and one responder suffered injuries because of the incident.



HOUSTON, TX: 2022 - During unloading, an undeclared shipment of loose gunpowder and ammunition in a gaylord box listed on the shipping paper as “brass” exploded while being moved using a forklift. The explosion led to the death of the forklift operator.



LONG BEACH, CA: 2022 - The U.S. Coast Guard discovered sixteen shipping containers of undeclared lithium batteries labeled as “Synthetic Resins” on a cargo ship at the Port of Long Beach. There was a fire in one of the shipping containers and the clean-up took 363 days, causing significant supply chain disruptions.
