

Community of Practice Fact Sheet



The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has established a Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) community of practice (CoP) for SS4A grant recipients (i.e., political subdivisions of a State or territory, federally recognized Tribal governments, and metropolitan planning organizations).

The CoP is a part of FHWA's SS4A Technical Assistance Center (TAC) and will serve as an opportunity for SS4A grant recipients to share noteworthy practices, resources, and solutions to advance roadway safety at the regional, local, and Tribal levels.



What is my role in the CoP?

As a SS4A grant recipient, you play a foundational role in the CoP. While membership is voluntary, we strongly encourage you to attend regular meetings, provide your expertise and input on relevant matters, and share content for the upcoming SS4A Clearinghouse website. FHWA will chair the CoP (set agenda items, schedule meetings, identify speakers, etc.).



Why should I participate in the CoP?

The CoP is a unique opportunity to bring together SS4A grant recipients, spotlight the accomplishments you have made, and strategize as a group to improve roadway safety practices.

- 3 Virtual peer exchange meetings (each meeting will be topic specific)
