About the Carbon Reduction Program

Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act established the federal Carbon Reduction Program, "which provides funds for projects designed to reduce transportation emissions"

About the

Program

- 65% (~\$71) million is apportioned annually to regions based on population (Local)
- 35% (~\$39) million is apportioned annually to Caltrans (State)
- Caltrans prepared a "Carbon Reduction Strategy" planning document, approved by FHWA in February 2024

Carbon Reduction Strategy Outreach

Public workshops: 286 attendees from MPOs, RTPAs, • transit, non-profit, and general public reviewed and commented on approach to Carbon Reduction Strategy and eligible projects

Background

- **Regular coordination:** Regional Transportation Planning • Workgroup, Rural Counties Task Force, Statewide Federal Programming Group, and Roadway Pricing Workgroups, and internal coordination
- **Public comment period:** Draft document sent to over • 1,100 contacts on email list for 5-week comment period
- **FHWA review:** Previewed document prior to November • deadline and addressed comments

• Transportation carbon reduction targets achieved three ways: transition to zero emission, clean fuel sources, and reduce vehicle miles traveled


Climate Action Plan for Transp. Infrastructure

California Transportation Plan

- Build an integrated rail/transit network
- Include investments in zero emission
- Invest in a network of bike/ped infrastructure

State Share: Priced Managed Lanes

Executive Board made decision to utilize Carbon **Reduction Program State** funds for projects that add tolling for single occupant vehicles in existing lanes

State CRP

- Toll revenue to be re-invested in transit and other lowcarbon mobility alternatives
- First project approved for \bullet funding: <u>State Route 85</u> in Santa Clara County.



SR-85 Express Lanes Project

- 13.2 lane-miles (6.6 miles each direction) of express lanes on SR-85 and a short section of US-101
- Requested \$29m from Carbon Reduction Program which will fully fund the construction phase in combination with other funds already secured
- Toll revenue would be reinvested in • light rail line in freeway median

• Seeking to start construction in 2024
