KEY DEADLINES FOR GRANTEES

- All Grantees: Thank you to everyone who submitted their quarterly milestone and federal financial reports. The SMEs are reviewing now. If you have not, submit milestone reports through the online form. Submit the FFR to smartreports@dot.gov.
- FY22 Grantees: Thank you to everyone who submitted their Draft Implementation Reports. Feedback for those reports are being returned as it becomes available. If you are starting to work on your Final Implementation Reports, these are due at the end of your period of performance. Final Implementation Reports should be submitted as .PDFs to <u>smartreports@dot.gov</u>. Guidance for the Implementation Report is the same as that used for the Draft, and can be found on the <u>SMART website</u>.
- FY23 Grantees: the Data Management Plan, and the Evaluation Plan will all be due <u>Dec 15th</u>, <u>2024</u>, regardless of when your grant agreement is executed. The recording for the informational webinar reviewing these plans is available on the SMART website.

RESOURCES

• The Department has recently released our <u>Learning Agenda: FY 2024-2026</u>, our strategic plan for building evidence to inform decision making. It includes 22 topic areas from nine modal administrations that will help us advance five of DOT's Strategic Goals. This plan outlines the areas of research and evaluation that the Department is focused on, and many of the topic areas may be of interest to you as you progress in your projects and conduct your own evaluations. Areas include: Preventing Unsafe Conditions and Near-Misses from Escalating to Serious Events, Railroad Grade Crossings, Transportation Insecurity, and Establishing a National Multimodal Freight Corridor.

- The <u>National Cooperative Highway Research Program</u> (NCHRP) of the Transportation Research Board has recently released two new documents that may be of interest, especially as FY23 grantees work on their Data Management Plans.
 - NCHRP Web-Only Document 419: Implementing Data Governance at Transportation Agencies, Volume 1: Implementation Guide. As of 2023, two-thirds of the 51 state departments of transportation (DOTs) had established some form of agency-level data governance or were actively exploring setting up data governance in their agencies. NCHRP Web-Only Document 419: Implementing Data Governance at Transportation Agencies, Volume 1: Implementation Guide, from TRB's National Cooperative Highway Research Program, draws upon lessons learned and successful practices of these early adopters.
 - NCHRP Web-Only Document 419: Implementing Data Governance at Transportation Agencies, Volume 2: Communications Guide. Data governance involves changing the mindset and behaviors of data managers, producers, and users across the organization. Therefore, communication is key to success of any data governance initiative.
