Pursuant to Title 46 U.S.C., Section 3507(g)(4)(A):

The Cruise Vessel Security and Safety Act (CVSSA) perscribes security and safety requirements for most cruise ships that embark and disembark in the U.S. The Act (as amended in 2014) mandates reporting to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) of missing persons and certain alleged criminal activity occuring on board applicable cruise vessels. This quarterly report provides a numerical account of all incidents (reported to the FBI during this quarter, not necessarily occuring during this quarter) of missing person and alleged crimes reported under the relevant provisions of the CVSSA without regard to the investigative status of the incident.
