Dear Ms. Bader:

Corn Island Archaeology, LLC (CIA) appeals the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's removal of its DBE certification under the rules in <u>49 CFR Part 26</u> (the Regulation). KTC decertified for failure to cooperate, specifically for noncompliance with section 26.83(j). See sections <u>26.109(c)</u> and <u>26.87(f)(6)</u>.

CIA's appeal cites various health, staffing, and administrative issues as reasons for not timely filing the mandatory annual affidavit and proof of gross receipts. None of these reasons is a ground for reversal. See section 26.89(c). You acknowledge that CIA did not comply, and section 26.83(j) provides that the omission is a failure to cooperate. Section 26.109(c) in turn authorizes KTC to decertify the company as a result. KTC did so, we affirm its decision under section 26.89(f)(1).

CIA may reapply for certification at any time because the applicable waiting period has expired. This decision is administratively final.
