

RE: Revised ARRA Section 1201 Certification based on September 2009 FHWA Guidance

Dear Secretary LaHood,

Pursuant to Title XII, section 1201 of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (Pub. L. 111-5 (Feb. 17, 2009)) ("ARRA"), I hereby certify that the State of Colorado will maintain its effort with regard to State funding for the types of projects in Unites States Department of Transportation ("DOT") "covered programs" funded under ARRA. The enclosed list of DOT "covered programs" identifies the amount of funds the State plans to expend from State sources from February 17, 2009 to September 30, 2010, for the types of projects under the DOT "covered programs" funded under ARRA.

I understand if the State of Colorado is unable to maintain the level of funding set forth in the attached list of the types of projects under the DOT "covered programs" funded under ARRA, then the State of Colorado will, thereafter, be prohibited by the Secretary of Transportation from receiving additional limitation on obligations for Federal-aid highway and highway safety construction programs after August 1 for federal fiscal year 2011.
