- Building and rebuilding what is necessary to ensure that the nation's transportation infrastructure is safe, efficient, resilient and sustainable for all users.
- Deploying innovative materials, technologies, designs, and organizational approaches to maximize the value of both old and new transportation assets in a cost-effective manner.

Abstracts must be submitted electronically by March 13, 2017. They should be no longer than 400 words and should clearly state which theme they address and the content that will be presented.
