<p><u>Special Session: From Aspirations to Reality - Exploring PPP Mechanisms for Funding and Financing Transportation Infrastructure</u> Time: 11:15 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.</p> <p>Public Private Partnerships (PPPs) have gained greater acceptance as a creative tool not only to fund and finance transportation infrastructure but also for design, build, operation and maintenance. Senior U.S. and China experts</p>	

from the public sector and industry will discuss their aspirations for greater PPP utilization. A critical challenge that central government officials face is ensuring that state- and provincial-level governments, which are usually the transportation infrastructure PPP project sponsors, utilize global best practices when packaging a transaction, bidding it out to private investors/contractors, and then monitoring the project to a successful conclusion. Using case studies from the road and rail sectors, industry and government representatives will discuss what has worked, what has not, and what governments can do to improve the market environment for PPPs in the United States and China.
