Lav WG – Sample Survey of Accessible Lav Users

Brief Survey of Stakeholders and Travelers with Disabilities.

The purpose of this series of questions is to help members of the ACCESS Committee develop specific regulations that pertain to the definition of an **Accessible Lavatory** on a single aisle aircraft.

In answering the following questions think about your **expectations for an accessible aircraft lavatory**.

When you think of an accessible aircraft lavatory it permits the following functions.
