Minutes Third Meeting of the DOT ACCESS Committee July 11-12, 2016 Ritz Carlton Hotel, Arlington, VA

The Department of Transportation's Advisory Committee on Accessible Air Transportation (ACCESS) met on July 11-12, 2016 in Arlington, VA. In accordance with the Negotiated Rulemaking Act, 5 U.S.C. §561-570, and the Federal Advisory Committee Act (FACA), 5 U.S.C. App.2, the meeting was open to the public. Richard Parker, Facilitator, called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, July 11, 2016. The list of individuals attending the meeting is provided by **Attachment 1**. The agenda for the meeting is attached hereto as **Attachment 2**.

Committee Action

After welcoming remarks by the facilitator, Richard Parker, and the Department of Transportation Designated Federal Officer, Blane Workie, the proceedings commenced with a meeting of the Accessible Lavatories Subcommittee.

Accessible Lavatories Subcommittee.

Discussion began with a presentation by Catherine Burnett (FAA) regarding wheelchair regulations and the certification process. This presentation explained the Technical Standard Order Authorization (TSOA) as it relates to specific parts/material certifications and minimal performance standards. Each aircraft manufacturer has its own certification process so the timeline for introducing changes may vary. This was followed by a presentation from Michelle Albert and Roser Roca-Toha on the Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEM) timeline for development of an accessible lavatory concept. There was an introduction of two representatives from Bombardier Aerospace: Michael Block and Rob Grant. The Bombardier representatives proceeded to give a presentation on their "clean sheet" design, meaning they were able to design their aircraft from scratch, as they are newer to the industry. This sparked a lengthy discussion regarding new aircraft design versus retrofit implications in terms of time and production. The group then moved to discuss the findings of the Accessible Lavatory Subcommittee's trip to an aircraft hanger in Seattle with the objective of gaining a better understanding of the current state of aircraft lavatories. Lee Page, the representative from Paralyzed Veterans of America, presented the findings of this trip. Advocates expressed issues with many of the current lavatories as well as the on-board aisle chairs. Lee Page followed up this discussion with a presentation of his findings from a survey taken of PVA members. The group wrapped up the morning session by outlining the advocates specifications at this point:

- Process will require a three-tiered approach
- Will include aisle chairs for transferring to and from the lavatory
- Both dependent and independent transfers must be considered in an accessible lavatory
- Training airline staff is necessary

After lunch, the Airbus representative gave a short presentation on a new way of making lavatories more accessible in the short term with an innovative aisle chair known as the Hamburg chair.

The Committee then broke up into separate groups to discuss what they planned to include in their proposal and continued to caucus for the remainder of the day.

Service Animal Subcommittee.

The Committee reconvened the next morning, July 12, and opened discussions of the Service Animal Subcommittee. Richard Parker, Facilitator, began the session with the introduction of Jeanine Worden from the Department of Housing and Urban Development. The HUD representative presented the Department of Housing and Urban Development's approach to service animals. In this presentation the HUD representative detailed the laws that the they are to enforce and how different agencies in the federal government may have different definitions of a service animal based off of the regulations they enforce.

The Service Animal Subcommittee reported on the progress that both the advocates as well as the airlines had made in developing their proposals. After, the Committee broke up into smaller groups to discuss their respective positions on each issue and to determine a timeline for both an advocate proposal and an airline proposal. The Department of Transportation along with the Facilitator will work to reconcile the two proposals at the next plenary meeting in August.

IFE/IFCom Subcommittee.

After a short break, the In-flight Entertainment and In-flight Communications Subcommittee convened. The group began discussions by addressing several administrative issues:

- IFC will now be referred to as IFCom
- New subgroup for discussing cabin announcements
- New subgroup for addressing hardware and software accessibility
- New subgroup to discuss jurisdictional issues

The Committee began a review of the IFE Issue List document and decided that the discussion of IFE should be broken down by hardware and software and addressed separately. The committee agreed that a phased in approach would be necessary in order to have an immediate benefit and a fully accessible system. A vote was taken as to the issues that the group would address in these discussions and all voted to adopt the issues stemming from this conversation.

As the meeting came to a close the committee gave a brief overview of the next steps for each of the subcommittees and set action items to follow up on before the next plenary meeting.
